9 WHEREAS the current assignment of Lincoln County Ambulance Service Areas  
10 (ASAs) governed by Lincoln County Code (LCC) Chapter 7 is set to expire on June 30,  
11 2016 as set by Board Order #7-15-158; and

12 WHEREAS the County commenced the process for taking applications to reassign  
13 the ASAs in accordance with LCC 7.805 through 7.855. Applications have been  
14 received and are currently under review; and

15 WHEREAS the County received a letter via e-mail from Central Oregon Coast Fire  
16 and Rescue District dated April 19, 2016 indicating it will discontinue providing services  
17 to ASA #4 (Waldport Area). The letter indicated the services will be transferred to  
18 Pacific West Ambulance current holder of ASAs #1-3(North Lincoln, Depoe Bay and  
19 Central Lincoln Areas). The County is treating this situation as a reassignment of ASA  
20 #4 pursuant to LCC 7.831. The letter describes the arrangement reached by the parties.  
21 A copy of the e-mail and letter is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 1.  
22 Pacific West Ambulance will supply information to the County detailing its capacity to  
23 provide services in ASA #4; and

24 WHEREAS the reassignment period normally would be for the remainder of the  
25 unexpired term of the ASA holder. Since the ASA term expiration is less than 90 days  
26 from the date of this Order, the County desires to extend the expiration date to December  
27 31, 2016, as allowed by LCC 7.831(2). This will allow for proper consideration of new  
28 applications for ASA #4 in accordance with LCC 7.831 and the remainder of LCC  
29 Chapter 7.

1 NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

2 1. The Assignment of Lincoln County Ambulance Service Area #4 (Waldport Area)  
3 is transferred to Pacific West Ambulance effective May 1, 2016 and continuing as  
4 extended by the County to December 31, 2016.

5 2. County staff are authorized to prepare and undertake a process consistent with  
6 LCC 7.831(1) and LCC 7.827 (including establishing new timelines) for submission of  
7 applications for ASA #4 to reassign the ASA after December 31, 2016 for the remainder  
8 of the term provided to other ASA in the County (five year terms).

9 3. A copy of this Order be provided to current ASA holders, Pacific West  
10 Ambulance, Central Oregon Coast Fire and Rescue District, the Ambulance Service  
11 Review Committee, Dispatch Services (WVCC, Toledo and Lincoln City) and fire districts  
12 and law enforcement agencies within the County.
