Lincoln County will be receiving funds through the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program to replace a timber bridge that was built in 1972 and will no longer support its designed capacity. This easement is critical to the completion of this project.

The rights granted by this easement shall terminate at the end of the project or three years from the start of construction, whichever is sooner.

**Letter of Agreement**

Dear Mr. Sanders,

In response to your email of July 5, 2016 in answer to the County request for a Temporary Construction Easement over Nestucca Forests property, Lincoln County has selected option #2. The Temporary Construction Easement will be converted into a Lincoln County legal right-of-way for the duration of the construction work on the bridge so that any accidents or issues on this road or with this road will be the responsibility of the county, as with any Lincoln County road.

The executed Temporary Construction Easement must be submitted to the County Commissioners for them to execute a Board Order proclaiming the alignment to be a Lincoln County Legal right of way for the duration of the project.

A Temporary Construction Easement with a term of two years and 11 months from date of signature, is enclosed for review. The document is minus the center line legal description which will be available for inclusion in the document within the week. The metes and bounds description in the easement originally submitted with the donation request, will be replaced by the center line description. When the Board Order takes effect, a copy will be transmitted to you.

A Donation Agreement is also attached for signature. This is needed to meet the requirements of federally funded projects when property owners donate property rights without compensation. The Agreement provides evidence to the project reviewer that Nestucca Forest Property is aware that they could be compensated for the property right and voluntarily waives the right to an appraisal and compensation. This is required for federal funding of the project.

**Solarize Oregon/Lincoln County - an informational presentation by the Lincoln County Solid Waste District and Environment Oregon to provide additional resources for the installation of residential solar power.**

Steps:

- 1) Today's presentation on how a residential solar program that provides education resources, workshops and additional discounts from solar installers could increase the amount of residential solar power installed in Lincoln County.
- 2) If approved the program cost is \$10,000 (\$5,000 from Lincoln County and the match provided by participating cities).
- 3) Lincoln County Sustainability Coordinator would provide in-kind management of the overall program.
- 4) NW Seed to provide workshops and educational materials – details yet to be worked out.
- 5) Meet with Central Lincoln People's Utility District on Friday, August 12<sup>th</sup> to address any concerns with the program and modify as needed.
- 6) BOC, September 7<sup>th</sup> – PUD comments on proposed program.
- 7) Decision: if approved seek additional match funding from cities and pass a resolution in increase residential solar power in Lincoln County.



#### (4) Newport Demonstration Garden

Located at the Oregon Coast Community College (OCCC) in South Beach. Constructed in 2010, the garden consists of a greenhouse powered by two solar roof panels; water collection system; rock garden; raised beds for vegetables and herbs; a cloche for growing tomatoes; potato growing bags; wine barrels filled with flowers; a raised accessible bed and a trellis bed for peas and beans. A large dedicated educational compost area is also available.




#### (5) Yachats Demonstration & Community Garden




### (3) Yaquina Bay Lighthouse Garden (YBLG)

This garden is a collaboration between Newport's Elementary Schools and Lincoln County Master Gardeners, Oregon State Parks & Recreation, Friends of Yaquina Lighthouses, and local community support. The garden is a historical and cultural gem in the community. MG's provide instruction to students in seed propagation at the school greenhouse and planting at the YBLG during the spring, along with a full harvest field trip in early fall. A nutrition lesson and tasting of vegetables grown at the garden is a welcome treat for the students, hopefully sparking a lifetime interest in gardening and sustainability.
