Lincoln County

What is it?

- Anonymous and voluntary survey.
 - Administered to students in 8th and 11th grade state-wide.
 - Usually all Lincoln County schools participate.
 - Administered on odd years (ex: 2015, 2017).
 - Results highlight strengths and areas needing more attention and effort.

General Health

17.6%

Of 8th graders rate their general health as fair or poor.

14.9%

Of 11th graders rate their general health as fair or poor.



Emotional Health

32.3%

Of 8th graders rate their emotional health as fair or poor.

37.6%

Of 11th graders rate their emotional health as fair or poor.



Lincoln County Marijuana Use

5.9%

Of 8th graders have had used marijuana in the last 30 days

Marijuana has serious impacts on the developing brain

- Attention
- Memory
- Learning
- Mental health

20.2%

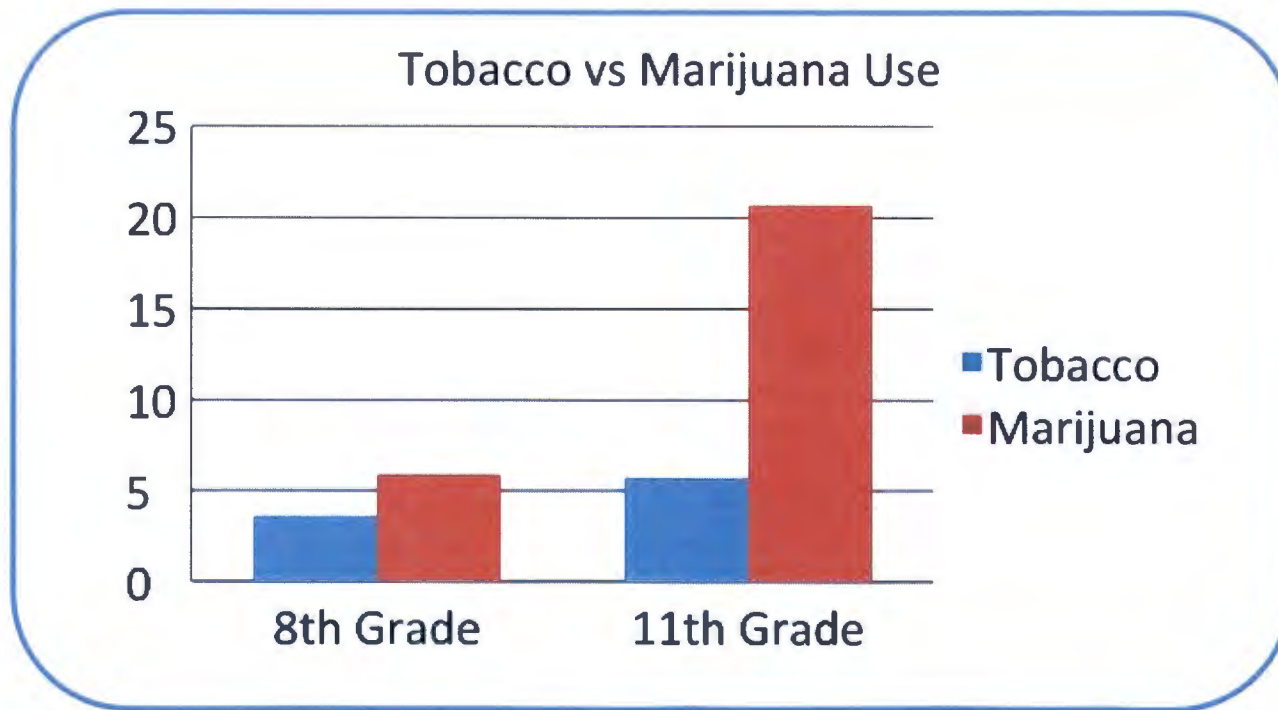
Of 11th graders have had used marijuana in the last 30 days

That's 1 in 5



Lincoln County Marijuana Use

- Only 50.2% of 11th graders haven't tried marijuana, much higher than the 8th grade average of 87.9%.
- While tobacco use grows slightly from 8th to 11th grade, marijuana use increases dramatically.



Lincoln County Tobacco Use

3.6%

Of 8th graders have smoked cigarettes in the last 30 days

5.7%

Of 11th graders have smoked cigarettes in the last 30 days



E-cigarette or vaping use is higher than cigarette use in both groups

4.4% for 8th graders and 6.2% for 11th graders.



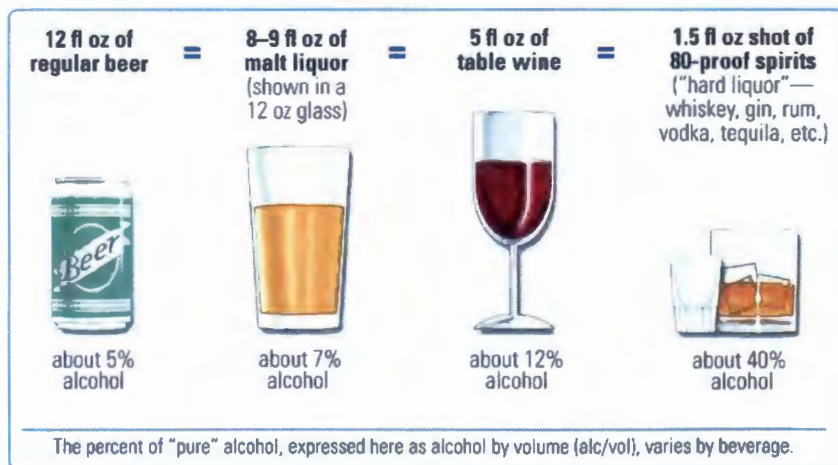
Lincoln County Alcohol Use

11.6%

Of 8th graders have had at least 1 drink in the last 30 days

25%

Of 11th graders have had at least 1 drink in the last 30 days



Approximately 25% of both groups reported using alcohol at age **14 years or younger**, placing them at a four times greater risk of lifetime alcohol-related problems.

Lincoln County Rx Drug Use

5.2%

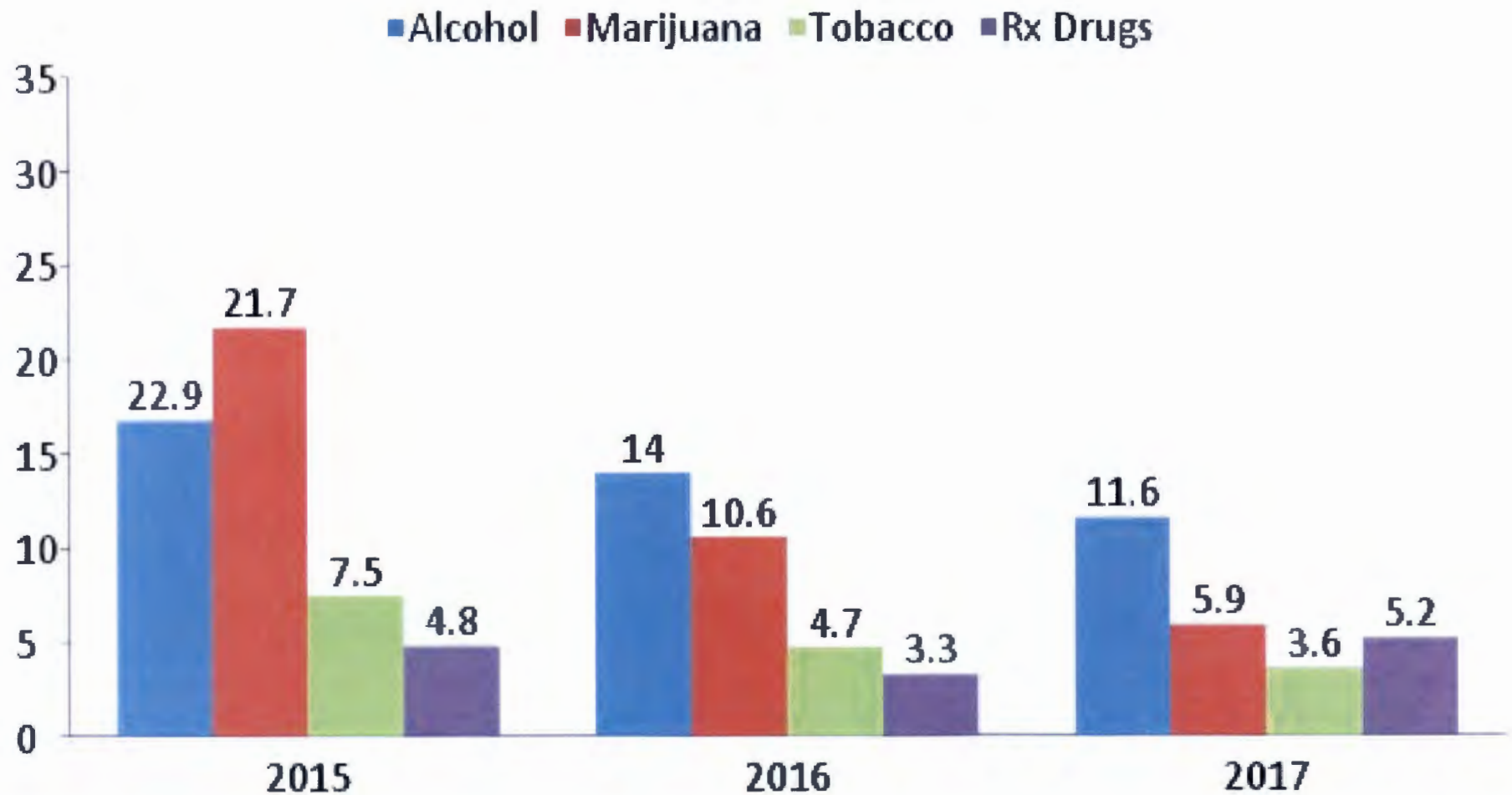
Of 8th graders have had used Rx drugs without a prescription in the last 30 days

5.5%

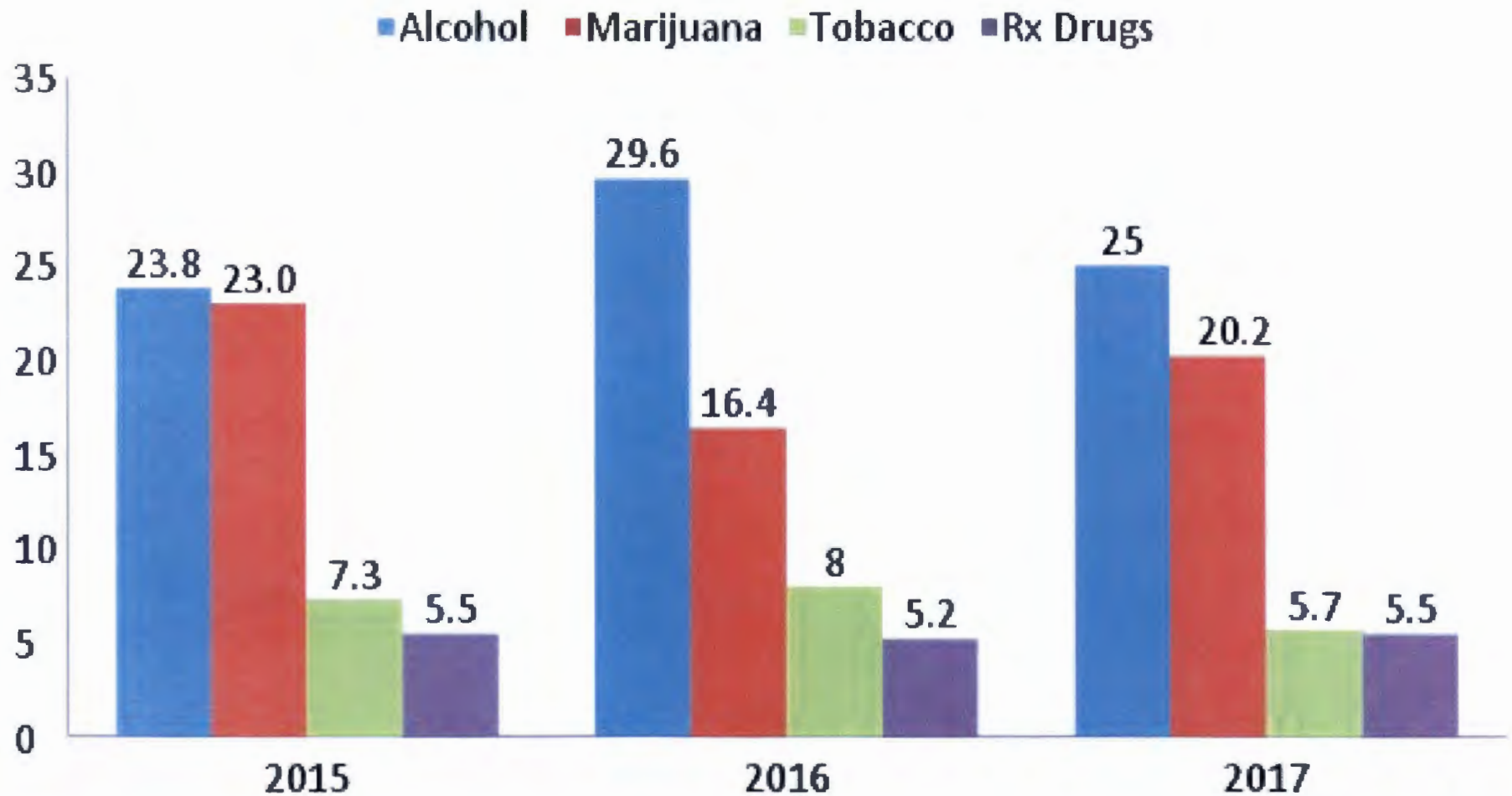
Of 11th graders have had used Rx drugs without a prescription in the last 30 days

Approximately 30% of both groups reported it would be **very easy** or **sort of easy** to get prescription drugs not prescribed to them.

8th Grade Comparative Drug Use

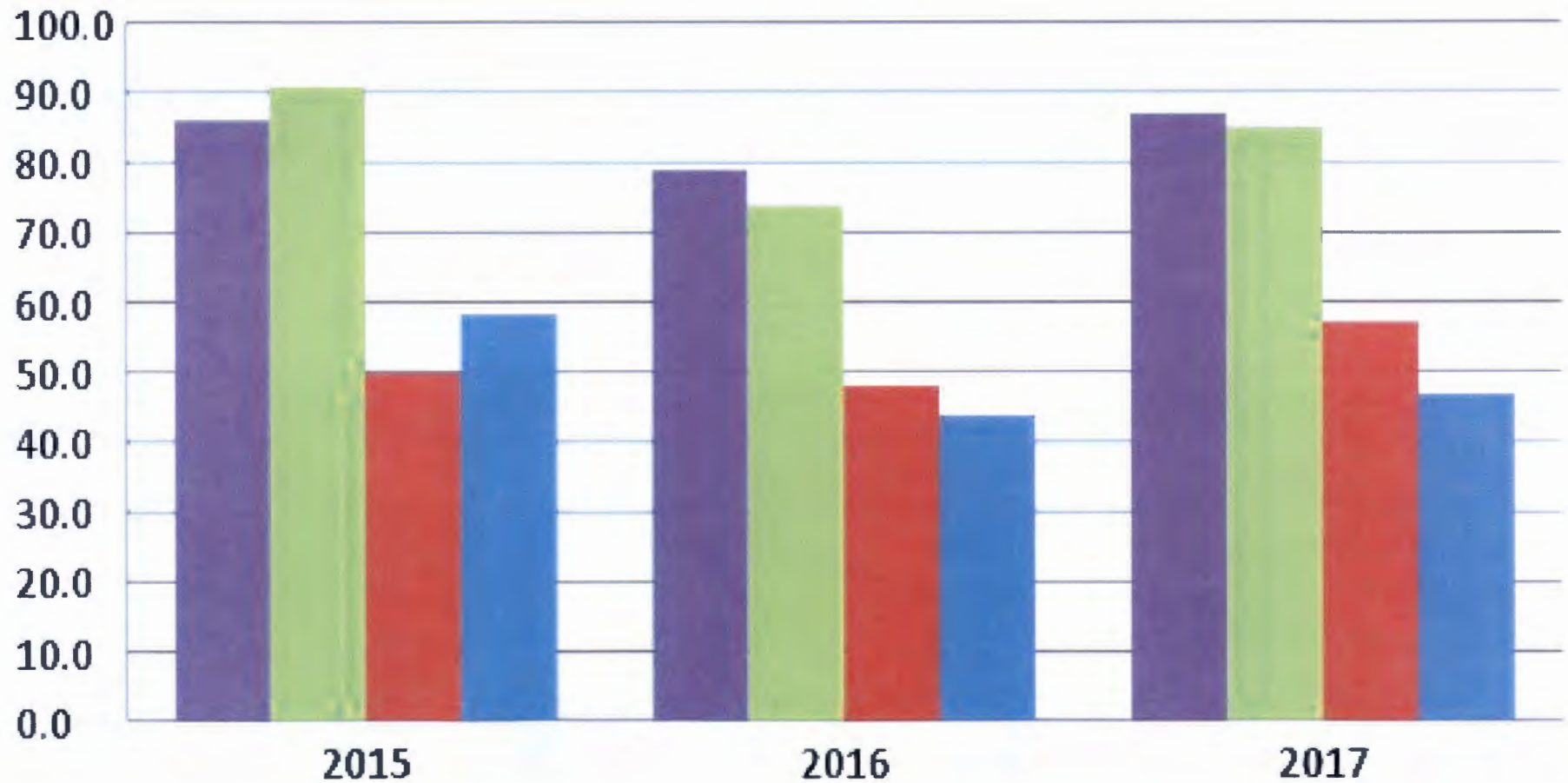


11th Grade Comparative Drug Use



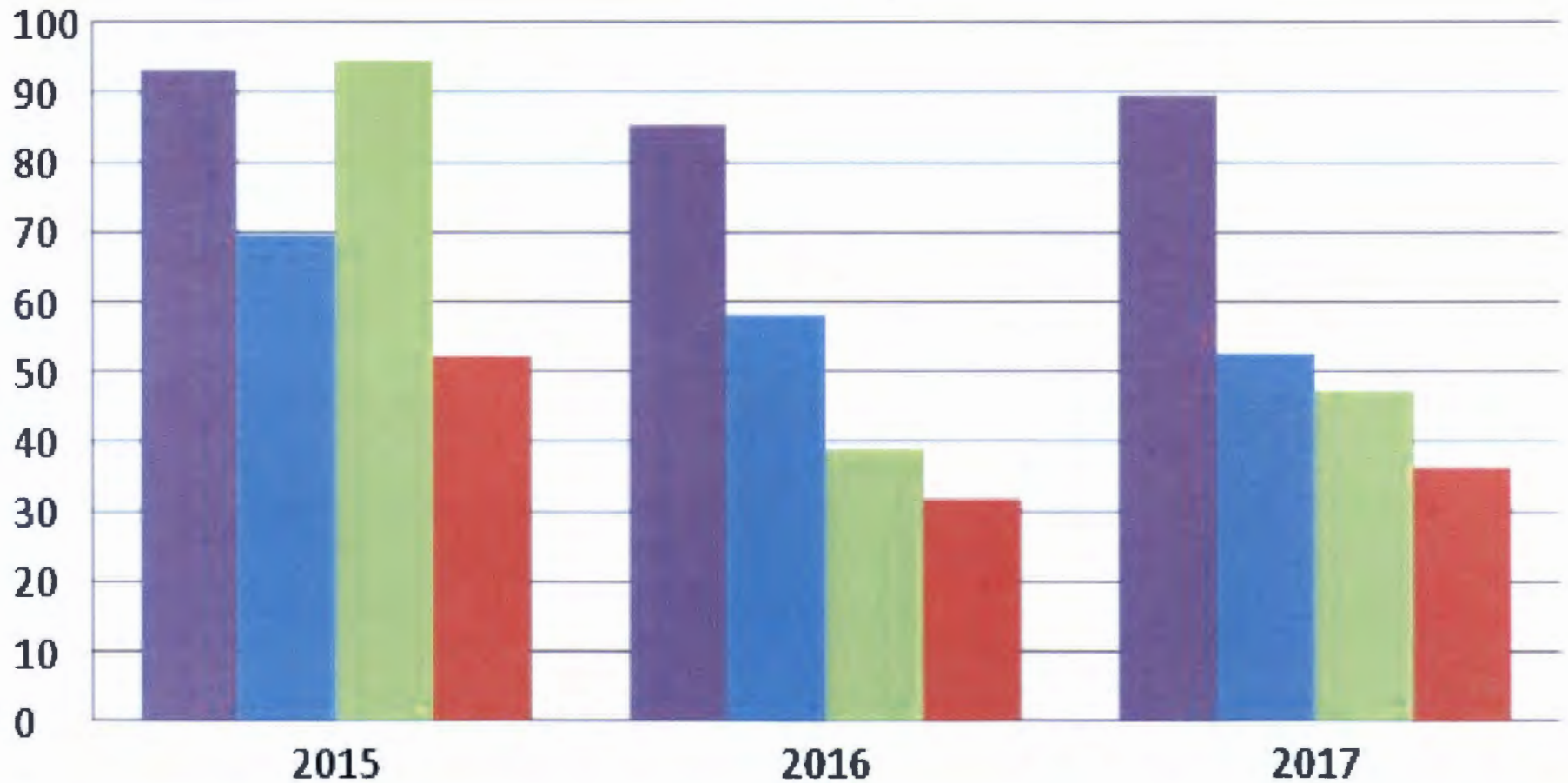
Perception of Harm Comparison

Perception of Harm Comparison

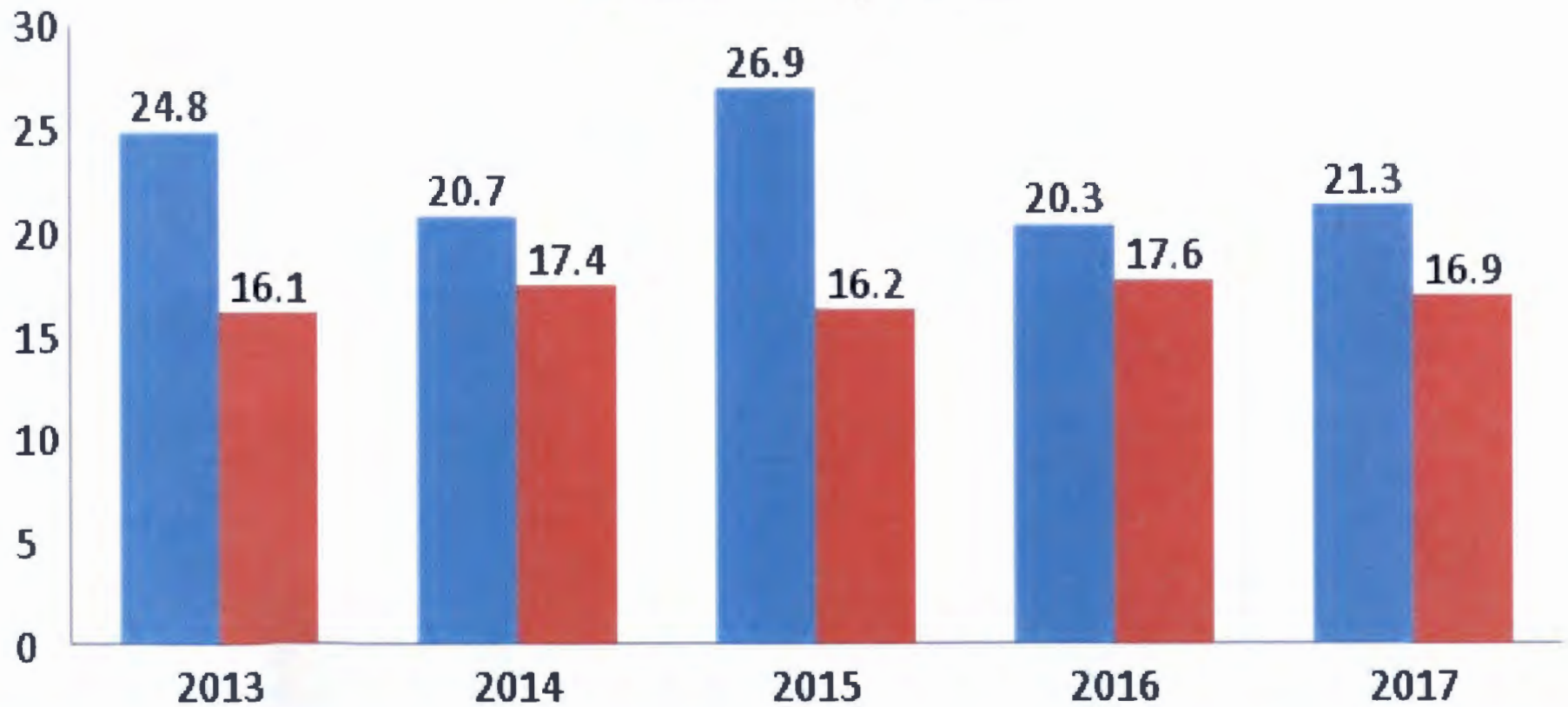

8th Grade

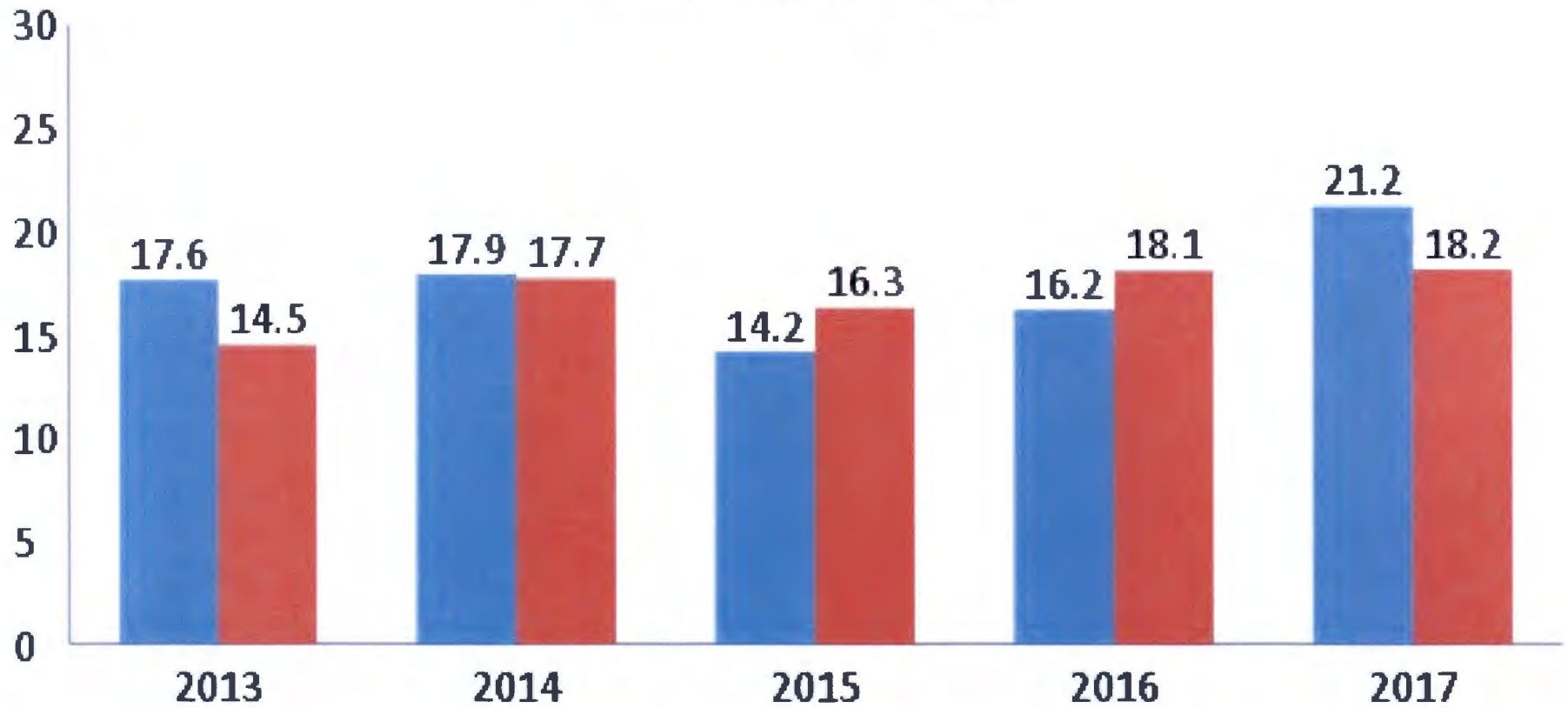
