6 7 8	WHEREAS, Lincoln County Treasurer Linda Pilson has submitted a letter of official notification to the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners advising the Board that she is retiring (resigning from office) effective June 29, 2018; and
9 10	WHEREAS, the aforementioned letter has been forwarded to the Lincoln County Clerk, Dana Jenkins; and
11 12	WHEREAS, the resignation date will occur before the completion of her current term as Lincoln County Treasurer; and
13 14 15	WHEREAS, when a vacancy occurs in the office of the county treasurer, the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners appoints a person qualified under law to fill the vacancy until the office is filled by election, in accordance with ORS 236.210(1); and
16 17 18 19	WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the next available election date is the general election in November of 2018 to assume the office in January of 2019. The County Clerk and County Counsel have opined that the person elected treasurer at that time will begin a new four year term; and
20 21 22	WHEREAS, the person appointed to fill the office on an interim basis must meet the same qualifications that are required by law to be elected to that position, per ORS 236.210(4); and
23 24	WHEREAS, the qualifications for the office of county treasurer, a nonpartisan office, under ORS 204.116 are:
25 26	(1) Citizen of the United States and elector under the Oregon Constitution; and(2) Resident of Lincoln County for a period of one year prior to the appointment; and
27 28	WHEREAS, in Lincoln County, the Treasurer also serves as the tax collector for Lincoln County; and
29 30 31	WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners must now determine the process for selecting an interim treasurer and tax collector. This process will include a timetable to make a decision, and the actual application, interview and selection process.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:


- 1. The vacant office of the Lincoln County Treasurer shall be filled in accordance with the law.
- 2. Qualified applicants must submit a letter of interest in being appointed interim Lincoln County Treasurer, which includes tax collection duties. In that letter the applicant must describe his or her background, experience and qualifications for the position. The letter should also indicate whether the applicant desires to accept the interim appointment only, or will also stand for election in November of 2018 for a full year term. The letter should include no less than three references who can comment on the applicant's professional demeanor and management experience.
- 3. The letter of interest must be received in the Board of Commissioners Office, Lincoln County Courthouse, Room 110, 225 W. Olive Street, Newport, OR 97365 by no later than 5:00 P.M. on June 6, 2018.
- 4. Upon review and determination that the applicant(s) meet the minimum qualifications, the Board of Commissioners may conduct interviews of any or all of the applicants at a regular Board meeting or special board meeting set for the interviews. The Board may continue the interviews to gather more information or ask more questions at its discretion.
- 5. After all of the interviews are completed, the Board will schedule deliberations at a regular board meeting or special board meeting, and then make a decision.
