If adopted by the voters, the new charter will go into effect on July 1, 2012. The proposed charter would designate the Mayor as administrative head of the city, clarifying the Mayor has the authority to act as City Administrator. The proposed charter amends Chapter VII, Section 25 to change the Mayor's term of office from two years to four years. Changes in Chapter VIII of the proposed charter would define the roles of the City Attorney, Municipal Court and Municipal Judge and the method for establishing the court and appointing those officers. The proposed charter would eliminate the requirement for pre-approval by voters of the purchase or sale of city property.
