<p><b>A</b></p> <p align="center"><b>INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTER USE A PENCIL ONLY</b></p> <p>TO VOTE, BLACKEN THE OVAL (●) COMPLETELY TO THE LEFT OF THE RESPONSE OF YOUR CHOICE.</p> <hr/> <p align="center"><b>CARMEL-FOULWEATHER SANITARY DISTRICT</b></p> <p><b>21-49 A 3-YEAR LOCAL OPTIONS OPERATING LEVY FOR LOCAL SANITARY CONTROL.</b></p> <p><b>QUESTION:</b> Shall the C.F.S.D. levy \$.46/\$1000 valuation annually beginning 1998-1999, for 3 years to develop sanitary solutions at the local level?</p> <p>This proposed local option levy tax is to be imposed for a total of 3 years.</p> <p>This measure may cause property taxes to increase more than three percent.</p> <p><b>SUMMARY:</b> This measure may be passed only at an election with at least a 50 percent voter turnout.</p> <p>The existence of the Carmel-Foulweather sanitary district allows for local control of sanitary issues in our communities. The last levy requested, and passed by voters, was in 1975. The C.F.S.D. has operated on that money since then. Now the District's operating budget has become critically depleted. With new funding the budget would allow the District, with input of ideas from the local community, to continue to develop strategies to maintain the health and the environmental well-being of the District. This levy, of \$.46/\$1000 valuation would raise approximately \$29,000/year for three years, for a total of \$87,000. Without funds from this levy the District is in danger of dissolution, which would result in county-level control of our community's sanitary issues.</p> <p>The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the county assessor at the time of the estimate.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES</p> <p><input type="radio"/> NO</p>	<p><b>B</b></p> <p align="center"><b>CITY OF LINCOLN CITY</b></p> <hr/> <p><b>21-50 AMENDS CHARTER ALLOCATION OF LODGING TAX; RESTRICTS AND REVISES USES</b></p> <p><b>QUESTION:</b> Shall City Charter dedicate 2/7 of lodging tax to VCB Fund tourism marketing, 4/7 to streets, parks, celebrations, visitor facilities?</p> <p><b>SUMMARY:</b> Charter presently provides 7% lodging tax. 1/7 of tax pays bond debt. 3/7 goes to the Visitors and Convention Bureau Fund. 3/7 is for streets and parks. Charter does not restrict the use of funds going to the VCB Fund.</p> <p>Amendment reduces VCB Fund share to 2/7, with use limited to marketing Lincoln City tourism. Amendment increases to 4/7 the share for streets and parks and allows use for celebrations, visitor signs, and visitor facilities.</p> <p>Does not create new tax. Refusing to yield the floor when councilors and citizens are trying to speak.</li> <li>- Voted for double taxation by multiple fire districts.</li> <li>- Author of and voted for original sewer surcharge fee to include city fines and legal fee to be charged to sewer users based on water usage. -Voted against removal of said fees. Claimed this surcharge was fair and equitable.</li> <li>- Insensitive to citizens needs with a statement of "don't flush your toilet" to avoid higher water, sewer and surcharge fees.</li> <li>- Apposition stance admirable and beneficial when the goal is public interest, carried to extreme it becomes detrimental.</li> <li>- Voted both ways, Yes and No, on a issue brought before council.</li> </ul> <hr/> <p align="center"><b>JUSTIFICATION OF HIS COURSE IN OFFICE BY DAN SAGAITIS, CITY OF WALDPART COUNCIL MEMBER:</b></p> <p>I serve on Waldport City Council with one purpose, to make lawful decisions in the best interest of the citizens.
