<p align="center"><b>County Measure</b></p> <p><b>21-165</b> Increases Lincoln County transient lodging tax from 9% to 10%</p> <p><b>Question:</b> Shall County lodging tax be increased 1%, with revenues for fairgrounds redevelopment and operations or similar projects?</p> <p><b>Summary:</b> Since 2007, Lincoln County has levied a voter approved 9% tax on transient lodging. It is paid by tourists, business travelers and other visitors. Currently, a portion of the tax revenues are dedicated to tourism promotion, economic development, support for the Oregon Coast Aquarium and a Fairgrounds Facilities Improvement Fund. This measure would enact Ordinance # 485 to increase the transient room tax by 1%, from 9% to 10%. It is estimated the increase would raise \$176,000 annually. The additional revenue would be available for future fairgrounds redevelopment and operations, or similar facilities and operations throughout the County. A "Yes" vote enacts Ordinance # 485 and increases the County transient lodging tax to 10%. A "No" vote keeps it at 9%.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> Yes</p> <p><input type="radio"/> No</p>	<p align="center"><b>Siletz Area Enhanced Law Enforcement Service District</b></p> <p><b>21-166</b> Formation of Enhanced Law Enforcement Service District/Establishment of Levy</p> <p><b>Question:</b> Shall County form Siletz Area Enhanced Law Enforcement Service District, adopt permanent rate levy of \$1.31 per \$1,000 beginning FY2016-17?</p> <p><b>Summary:</b> At the request of the City of Siletz, Siletz Tribe and surrounding community, Lincoln County initiated formation of the Siletz Area Enhanced Law Enforcement Service District and adoption of a permanent District tax rate levy, both subject to voter approval in a single vote. The intent of this measure is to provide the District with enhanced law enforcement services through the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office. Supplemental funding is to be provided by the Siletz Tribe under contract with the District. The District formation was approved by the Siletz City Council. The District boundaries are the same as the existing boundaries of the Siletz Rural Fire Protection District.</p> <p>Approval of this measure authorizes formation of Siletz Area Enhanced Law Enforcement Service District and adopts a permanent District rate levy of \$1.31 per \$1,000 of assessed value beginning Fiscal Year (FY) 2016-17. A "yes" vote forms the District and establishes the District tax rate levy. A "no" vote will reject both the District formation and the establishment of the tax rate levy.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> Yes</p> <p><input type="radio"/> No</p>	<p align="center"><b>Central Oregon Coast Fire &amp; Rescue District</b></p> <p><b>21-168</b> Five Year Local Option Tax #2 for COCF&amp;RD</p> <p><b>Question:</b> Shall COCF&amp;RD levy \$1.27 per \$1000 assessed value for five years, beginning in 2016-2017, for operations?</p> <p>This measure may cause property taxes to increase more than three percent.</p> <p><b>Summary:</b> Approval of this measure would subject tax assessable property in the Central Oregon Coast Fire and Rescue District to additional property taxation for five years in the amount of one dollar and twenty-seven cents per \$1000 assessed property value (tax years 2016-2017 through 2020-2021).</p> <p>It is estimated that this measure would raise approximately \$439,384 in tax revenues for 2016-2017, \$452,566 in tax revenues for 2017-2018, \$466,142 in tax revenues for 2018-2019, \$480,126 in tax revenues for 2019-2020, and \$494,530 in tax revenues for 2020-2021.</p> <p>Revenues would be used by the Central Oregon Coast Fire and Rescue District to fund its fire, rescue, and Emergency Medical Services operations.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> Yes</p> <p><input type="radio"/> No</p>		
<p align="center"><b>City of Newport</b></p> <p><b>21-164</b> Resumption of Fluoridation of City of Newport Water Supply</p> <p><b>Question:</b> Shall the City of Newport resume fluoridation of the city water supply?</p> <p><b>Summary:</b> The City of Newport supplies water to city residents and businesses. In the past, the City of Newport fluoridated the city water supply. Currently, the city water supply is not being fluoridated.</p> <p>This measure requires the City of Newport to resume fluoridation of the city water supply. The measure requires fluoridation at state and federal recommended levels. The measure is a referral of Ordinance No. 2088, adopted by the City Council on February 1, 2016. The date for resumption of fluoridation of the city water supply will be established by resolution of the City Council. Fluoridation products used in the city water supply must meet NSF International standards. The measure requires recordkeeping and testing of the city water supply in accordance with state and federal standards. The measure also requires the city to conduct tests for fluoridation levels in the city water supply in accordance with state and federal requirements. Preliminary cost estimates are approximately \$300,000 for implementation. Initial estimates for operations are \$18,000 annually. Costs are paid through water rates in the city budget.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> Yes</p> <p><input type="radio"/> No</p>	<p align="center"><b>Southwest Lincoln County Water People's Utility District</b></p> <p><b>21-167</b> Formation of the Southwest Lincoln County Water People's Utility District</p> <p><b>Question:</b> Should the Southwest Lincoln County Water People's Utility District be formed?</p> <p><b>Summary:</b> At the request of petitioners, this measure would create a People's Utility District (PUD) to provide domestic water service in the area currently served by the Southwest Lincoln County Water District. The PUD is intended to replace the Southwest Lincoln County Water District as the water service provider. The boundaries of the proposed PUD will be the same as the existing boundaries of the Southwest Lincoln County Water District.</p> <p>The PUD would be governed by a five member Board of Directors elected from the PUD. The PUD would have power to provide water services and set water rates. The PUD does not propose to provide electricity services.
