## COMMUNITY SERVICE / RESTITUTION PROGRAM

Our primary goal is to provide a safe and supervised community service program that enables youth to give back to their communities and repair the harm caused to their victims. Youth perform a variety of service projects, in a variety of settings.

Lincoln County Juvenile Department program participants will collect trash from sites and coordinate with local Forest Service Agency for transportation of the material to appropriate facilities

This project is an ongoing effort coordinated between the Central Coast Ranger District and the Lincoln County Juvenile Dept. On the Oregon coast, nearly all-consumptive water used comes from easily contaminated surface water, frequently from relatively small streams or springs. In Lincoln County, trash dumping continues to be pervasive, and dumpsites can be found off any forest road. Consequently, there is a great deal of concern about drinking water quality, as reflected the Source Water Protection Plans written by local water suppliers.

Sadly, there is still no lack of dumpsites to clean. The Siuslaw National Forest and Lincoln County Juvenile Dept. are working together to connect resources for trash collection, removal and recycling. The Juvenile Department operates a community service and victim restitution program. Participants are not incarcerated. This program has become an important part of cleaning up dumpsites, while providing an opportunity to reach the community at large about the negative impacts of trash dumping.

Project partners include the Oregon Youth Conservation Corps, Community Services Consortium, Mid-Coast Watersheds Council, OSU Extension, Siuslaw National Forest, Lincoln Soil, and Water Conservation District, Lincoln County Sherriff Department and the public at large. These partners will provide information about dumpsite locations and materials. As well as coordinate the transport of trash to the transfer station and recycling of metals.

While accountability is one of the main aspects of this program, restorative community service provides an opportunity for the juvenile offender to make amends to the community in a way that is valued by the community. With the community service work experience it allows youth to create new, positive relationships with members of the community, the fabric of the community is strengthened. The process also works to increase the juvenile offender's investment in the community and themselves. Through the Community Service Program young offenders learn the importance of showing up for work on time, how to follow instructions, along with teamwork, social skills, respect and an awareness of self-image.


