Ordinance No. 38

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATIONS AND CONTROL OF THE PARKING AND ROAD AREAS OF THE LINCOLN COUNTY COURTHOUSE IN NEWPORT, OREGON. SAID ORDINANCE TO COVER ALL AREAS AND PROPERTY UNDER JURISDICTION OF THE LINCOLN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS.

The Board of County Commissioners for Lincoln County, Oregon, does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1: PURPOSE. The purposes of this Ordinance is to establish maintenance, control traffic, and designate an orderly system of parking and the moving of vehicles for all persons using the parking area and public accesses to and from the "Court-house Area".

SECTION 2: DEFINITIONS. As used in the provisions of this Ordinance, hereafter set forth:

- (1) Area Described: All lands, buildings and exits included in and as belonging to the County of Lincoln located at 225 West Olive, commonly known as the Lincoln County Courthouse.
- (2) Public Accesses: Roads leading to or from the described area.
- (3) Roads: All area used for travel or moving of vehicles.

- (4) Parking Area: Any space marked or unmarked in the described area which may be or is used for the parking of automobiles or other transportation vehicles.
- (5) Board: Is the Board of Lincoln County Commissioners.
- (6) Parking Space: The individual or separate spaces designated or marked for each vehicle; markings generally referred to in this Ordinance are painted but may be designated otherwise.
- (7) Personnel: Employees of Lincoln County.
- (8) Sidewalks: Any space designated in or bordering the Courthouse area which is used for foot traffic. The term sidewalk also includes designated safety lanes which are signed or marked (painted) as a walking or foot traffic area.
- (9) Courthouse: Lincoln County Courthouse located in Newport, Oregon at 225 West Olive Street.

SECTION 3: GENERAL INFORMATION. The parking area of the Courthouse is not providing adequate or necessary parking facilities. It is the Board of Commissioners opinion that this condition can be improved and more spaces be made available for daily use. The Board of Commissioners further feel the use of the parking area next to the building should be reserved for use by the public. It is the intent of the Board to improve, change and reserve parking space for its employees, alter or change markings and create more spaces and allow use of parking for the public or handicapped next to the building or sidewalk area.

SECTION 4: PUBLIC PARKING. All individual parking spaces next to the Courthouse building or sidewalk area next to the Courthouse or other public buildings used for offices shall be used for public parking or handicapped as indicated by the posted signs or curb markings. All areas which are painted white

are to be used for public parking. Public parking areas shall have a 90 minute time limit. Additional time may be obtained from the receptionist at the telephone switchboard. Additional public parking is available in parking lot and it will be signed and painted as such. All public parking spaces will be painted white. Parking in reserved parking spaces which are colored _____ will be a violation of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5: EMPLOYEE PARKING. Employees working for Lincoln County in the Courthouse will have definite designated parking spaces. Parking in other areas or parking spaces by employees who have been assigned a designated parking space will be a violation of this Ordinance. Employees will receive their designated parking space from their director or supervisor. Changing of parking spaces can be made only by written permission from the Board of Commissioners with prior departmental head approval.

SECTION 6: If adopted by the County Governing Body, the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners ordains as follows:

In case of adoption or ratification by the Voters of the County, the people of Lincoln County ordain as follows:

SECTION 6: VIOLATION AND ENFORCEMENT. Violation and Enforcement of any County Ordinance is subject to a fine of not more than \$250.00 and the enforcement of said Ordinance is subject to Section 8 of Chapter 282 and any officer may enforce an Ordinance adopted under this act as described in ORS 161.015.
